He met Choru on the way to the pond. They were best friends who played all day long.




Munia saw them marching with their fishing rods.

Kicchu and Choru held on tight to their rods.


Kicchu screamed, "MY FISH!" Choru also screamed, "NO... MY FISH!"




Kicchu pulled hard... Choru pulled harder...
